Welcome to the Spring edition of our Hi Society magazine.

The current weather has certainly helped many of us feel spring-like although the most recent period of market turmoil feels more like Autumn storms.

I'd like to say thank you to those who attended the recent AGM in February and provided a wide range of questions for us to answer. They are shown on our website if you were unable to attend. We continue to make progress on our IT change programme which will bring benefits including addressing some of the questions asked about when online services can be adapted. The new platform will have wider and more extensive digital capabilities, so once the base work is done and is live, that will be in the next phase to follow. It will remain a matter of choice for members as to whether they want to use the online services or not.

As I explained at the AGM that squeeze on the net margin along with the increased costs of IT change will make for low profits this year. However, we remain confident that this is the right change for the Society and helps us to be able to provide customers with a choice how they access and use their savings and mortgage accounts.

The mortgages and savings markets continue to adapt to different characteristics. Many larger lenders are reducing their mortgage rates in the lower loan to value range well ahead of base rates moving. Savers on the other hand are benefiting from tight retail cash markets so seeing higher savings rates than would be indicated by either the cost of loans or the projected trajectory of base rates. We continue to offer fixed rated bonds in and outside the ISA wrapper as we know they are popular with members.

The potential changes to cash ISA allowances are an agenda driven by a small number of investment managers. It is an area where we are actively engaged with other Societies and our trade association, the Building Societies Association, to persuade ministers that any changes like those proposed are not needed nor desirable. 
CELEBRATING 20 YEARS OF PANTOMIME MAGIC WITH LOUGHBOROUGH TOWN HALL
